Roselle Officials Address Community, Commit \$100,000 to Fight Proposed ComEd High-Voltage Line Plan

Nearly 400 people attended a community information meeting hosted by the Roselle Village Board on March 21 to hear about their coordinated response to ComEd's proposed plan to install a new high-voltage electric line through Roselle along the south side of the I-390 corridor as part of its West Central Reliability Project.

"The Board of Trustees and I were delighted with the turn out for Monday night's meeting," said Roselle Mayor Gayle Smolinski. "Their presence allowed us to share information, answer questions, and see just how engaged our residents are on this issue. Keeping them engaged will continue to be our focus as we move forward with our strategy to oppose ComEd's plan."

The Village of Roselle is working with legal counsel, lobbyists, and neighboring communities, including Hanover Park, Itasca, Elk Grove Village, and Schaumburg to develop a strategy to contest the West Central Reliability Plan. At their March 14 meeting, the Village Board approved spending up to \$100,000 to oppose the project.
