**EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE MAYOR OF THE VILLAGE OF ROSELLE,
ILLINOIS: "EXTEND CURRENT LIQUOR LICENSES, WAIVE LIQUOR
LICENSE LATE FEES AND PROVIDE FOR LIQUOR CARRYOUT AND
HOME DELIVERY"**

WHEREAS, Article XIX "Emergency and Disasters" of Chapter 2 "Administration" of the Roselle Village Code grants authorization to the Mayor of the Village of Roselle to enter executive orders "upon the declaration of a local state of emergency"; and

WHEREAS, the authority to declare a state of emergency and to issue local executive orders under Chapter 2 Article XIX is exclusive to the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, I the Mayor of the Village of Roselle, Andrew Maglio, entered a declaration of local state of emergency based on the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Governor Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-07 requires all businesses that offer food or beverages for on-premises consumption to suspend service for all on-premises consumption and pursuant to the guidance provided by the Illinois Liquor Control Commission allowing the extension of renewal dates for state liquor licenses and allowing the temporary deliveries of alcohol liquor to promote social distancing; and ,

WHEREAS, I as Mayor/Liquor Commissioner have concluded that an executive order authorizing the temporary delivery of alcohol liquor by carry out or home delivery and the extension of all local liquor licenses expiring on April 30, 2020 is consistent with my authority under the law and the declaration of emergency, because it promotes social distancing and reduces person-to-person contact during the period of the COVID-19 pandemic; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BASED ON THE FOREGOING RECITALS, I, Andrew Maglio, as Mayor and Liquor Commissioner of the Village of Roselle, hereby order instantler, pursuant to my executive powers granted by law and the declaration of emergency the following:

SECTION 1. An extension of all local liquor licenses expiring on April 30, 2020. All current liquor licenses expire on April 30, 2020. Commencing

immediately all currently valid Roselle liquor licenses are hereby extended until July 31, 2020 and no late fees shall be assessed between April 30, 2020 and July 31, 2020. Commencing no later than August 1st, 2020 late fees will begin accruing again. Licensees shall submit applications for renewal of their liquor licenses for the period of April 30, 2020 to April 30, 2021 no later than July 10, 2020. All other terms and conditions of the licenses and responsibility of the license holders pursuant to Roselle Municipal Code remain in full force and effect during the extension period.

SECTION 2. Carryout and Home Delivery: All holders of liquor licenses not currently allowed carry out or off premises sales of alcoholic liquor are granted authority to sell beer and wine for carry out and off-premises consumption in accordance with the following:

a. Beer and wine only may be sold only with food orders at curbside pick-up, in-restaurant pick-up, and for at-home delivery. Home delivery shall be limited to residential properties only within the Village's corporate limits.

b. Home delivery shall only be performed by an employee of the license holder who is over the age of 21 (i.e. no 3rd party delivery companies). Prior to delivery proof of age of the recipient shall be verified by the license holder which may include the person lawfully delivering the beer and/or wine.


c. The sale of alcoholic beverages for curbside and in-restaurant pick-up and home delivery shall occur only during the liquor sale hours for the licensed premises as set forth in Chapter 3, Section 3-37 of the Roselle Municipal Code.

d. Prior to curbside and in-restaurant pick-up of the beer and/or wine, proof of age of the recipient shall be verified by the license holder. As required by Roselle Municipal Code, the individual verifying proof of age and providing the beer and/or wine shall be at least 18 years old.

e. Beer and wine shall only be picked-up and delivered in their original in sealed container (e.g. bottles, cans, boxes). No spirits, to-go cups or any kind of unsealed package may be sold for pick up or delivery.


SECTION 3. Liquor Law Enforcement: Other than as qualified by this order all other Codes, Ordinances and laws of the Village applicable to the sale and possession of alcoholic liquor in the Village of Roselle shall remain in full force and effect.
