1. Call to Order - The meeting was called to Order at 12:00 p.m.
2. Roll Call - Upon roll call, the following answered: Mayor Pileski; Leslie Drewitz; Mike Wold; Bianca Hervig; Wayne Domke; Christina Anderson Heller; Amanda Hausman; Barb Hochstadt; Maryann Grygiel; Marc Hoarle; and Melissa Brito.
3. Approval of Minutes – Motion to approve minutes from the February 11, 2022 meeting by B. Hochstadt; second by W. Domke. Motion carried.

4. UNFINISHED BUSINESS/WORK TO DATE

4A. Treasurer's Report:

A report on grant funding and monies available left to fulfill grants was given and discussed, along with costs for the Centennial relief sculpture.

5A. Ambassador Updates:

L. Drewitz reported on Arts DuPage who could be used to promote some centennial events.

M. Grygiel gave an update on the centennial ornaments and metal and wood samples were presented. She is working with the Lake Park High School shop classes to manufacture the ornaments. She has a sponsor that is covering the cost of two hundred of each kind or 400 of one kind. Profits from the sale of the ornaments will go to the Lake Park Foundation. Discussion of where the ornaments will be sold. Commission gave direction to order 400 ornaments in wood with a price of \$5.00 each. *Where ornaments will be sold will be discussed at a future meeting.*

The time capsule was discussed. Lake Park HS metals teacher is instructing class to create it. Size of time capsule will be determined by what will go into the time capsule. *Discussion about having residents nominate a time capsule item with the village at Village Hall, with a deadline of the end of May.*

June 12 is the classic car show parade that will travel from the American Legion to Trinity Lutheran. Festivities include a band, petting zoo, and a Shirli's reunion and ice cream.

A Hauser updated the commission on the RACF mural construction that will begin in May. *The group is looking for volunteers to help with the mosaic construction.*

C Heller reported that the Main Street Merchants Bootleggers Ball is scheduled for September 10, 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm, catering with elegance at Lynfred Winery. Beer, wine and DJ and tickets will be \$75.00 each, with 100 tickets to be sold. Theme will be the Roaring 20s.

In addition, there will be a RACF fundraiser at Lynfred from a Mother's Day truffle and wine package (one-third of the proceeds going to RACF).

M. Brito reported on the centennial banners that have been hung in the town center with more to come to the train station. Special event license plates will be sold over the summer, and will be valid August 10 through October 8. Plates will cost \$10 each.

W. Domke updated the group on the Bockfest that will take place on April 23. Pollyanna is making a special bock beer and they are expecting 250 participants to march in the parade prior to the event.

#### 5B. Public Art Project:

Costs discussed for the art reliefs, along with an anticipated installation date of September, 2022. Unveiling anticipated on October 7 at the Village Hal Homecoming event. Donations from some centennial events are going to the public art projects. This is a trial program and there may be a possible expansion later as a permanent village program.

## 6. New Business

6A. Bockfest Fund Request – Motion to approve the Bockfest funding request made by B. Hochstadt; seconded by C, Heller. Motion passed.

6B. Democracy Rocks Fund Request - the group is asking for \$150 for upfront costs/down payments. Motion to approve the Democracy Rocks request made by W. Domke; seconded by A, Hausman. Motion passed.

6C. Classic Car Parade Fund Request – the group is asking for \$721.19 for event expenses.. Motion to approve the Classic Car event event funding request made by C. Heller; seconded by A. Hausman. Motion passed.

6D. Winterfest, 2022 – Discussed centennial tie with Winterfest. Possible ideas: selling ornaments, and art crawl (painting windows of Main Street businesses); a Kriskindl mart along with a shop local campaign. *If any businesses are interested or have additional ideas, please have them contact Liz Sheffer in the Clerk's office.*

6E. Letters will go out to all approved funding requesters, letting them know their requests have been approved or denied. Some funding will be coming back to RACF for public art throughout the village.

7. Other Business

Commission meeting schedule to move to every other month or as needed.

New special events that take place this year can potentially take place annually.
